LITURGY

A Lenten Tradition: Veiling the Statues, holy Images, and Cross for Passiontide

Temporarily veiling the statues and religious images in the penitential colour of Lent is a beautiful custom that helps us to reflect on the deeper theological meaning of the liturgical season. Traditionally this custom is practiced during the last two weeks before Easter, starting on the Fifth Sunday, and ending during the Easter Vigil to mark the end of the penitential season. The crosses will be veiled, or removed from church, after the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday, and revealed on Good Friday during the celebration of the Passion of the Lord.
