Gospel: Luke 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we
do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he
must share with the man who has none, and the
one with something to eat must do the same.'
There were tax collectors too who came for
baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what
must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more
than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their
turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said
to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content
with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the
people, who were beginning to think that John
might be the Christ, so John declared before
them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is
coming, someone who is more powerful than I
am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his
sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit
and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear
his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into

his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

**The Synodal Pathway: Words for our Journey
Being a 'synodal' church.**

We've been seeing and hearing more and more things about the 'synodal pathway' – in the diocesan newspaper, parish notices, and further afield. But what is being 'synodal' all about? What it's not is simply to do with 'synods' – meetings of Bishops, or others, that discuss and decide things. Pope Francis, instead, wants us to contemplate 'synodality' as a daily, community, 'walking together'. This is, he tells us, what the church is being called to be, more and more, today and into the future. This walking together is about movement – we are on the move, heading somewhere; and it is about being alongside each other, and alongside all people around us, as witnesses to God's love for all. We need to find a way to walk together, figuring out the best paths to take, and what direction to go in. We might have to make new paths or wider roads for more to join in the journey. How can we be more of such a travelling, pilgrim, and joyful 'synodal' community?

Prayer: Father, in this Advent season give us the gift of your joy. Show us the way we should walk. Show us how to share. And may your Spirit guide us. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.
