LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus (35:12-14,16-19)

The Lord is a judge who is no respecter of personages. He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man, he listens to the plea of the injured party. He does not ignore the orphan's supplication, nor the widow's as she pours out her story.

The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds, until it arrives he is inconsolable, and the Lord will not be slow, nor will he be dilatory on their behalf.

R This poor man called; the Lord has heard him.

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy (4: 6-8, 16-18)

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me – may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was *rescued from the lion's mouth*. The Lord will rescue me from all evil attempts on me, and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel: Luke (18: 9-14)

Jesus spoke the following parable to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else: 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray, one a Pharisee, the other a tax

collector. The Pharisee stood there and said this prayer to himself, "I thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax collector here. I fast twice a week; I pay tithes on all I get." The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

LOLO WINTER WARM HUB: Even with government subsidies, energy prices have risen so much that some people will face challenges this Winter. In response to an initiative by S Cambs District Council, OLOL has formed a partnership with the Cambridge charity ACRE to create a Sawston 'Warm Hub' - a place where, for at least six hours per week people can come for warmth, companionship and refreshments.

The Church Hall will be opened for at least two half days each week so that people can gather in a warm and welcoming place.

For the project to take off volunteers are needed - ideally at least three per session. If you feel able to donate a few hours per month during the Winter please leave your email and telephone contact details with Fr John and a meeting will be organised to fine tune the details of the project.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - SHOE BOX

APPEAL: Once again we have been invited to take part in the above appeal. Last year our Parish filled 45 boxes and 10.5 million boxes were sent around the world. This year two thirds of the boxes packed in the UK are going to UKRAINE and the countries around who are supporting those who have fled the war.

This message is to encourage you to get involved again (maybe a first timer) and fill a shoebox. It is a way of showing God's love. Each box may be the only gift a child will receive, so often items are treasured for years after and even into adulthood. Adding a photo or short message in the box means so much (no address).
