#### LITURGY OF THE WORD

**First Reading:** From the **Acts of the Apostles:**(8:5-8,14-17) *They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit* 

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

**Second Reading: From the first letter of St Peter** (3:15-18) *In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.* 

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Anybody who receives my commandments and keeps them will be one who loves me; and anybody who loves me will be loved by my Father,

and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

### **DIOCESAN NEWS**

- + The Diocesan Welfare Coordinator has been appointed and will start on 1<sup>st</sup> June. Sarah Truman has been working in CAB in Bury Saint Edmunds and will begin by working 2 days a week. The role is to support priests approaching and already in retirement. An analysis of all 112 priests associated with the diocese has been completed and this will help to give an overview of all payments allowing equitable and adequate funding of retirement benefits for all priests.
- + Enhancing weekly giving. The Diocese will be interviewing some promising candidates for the position of Stewardship and Fundraising Coordinator, who once in post will help all parishes to increase their collections. Focus will be on increasing the numbers of those giving regularly by standing order and also agreeing to Gift Aid.
- + Diocesan Levy Holiday for Parishes. In order to help parishes with cash flow at this difficult time, the normal levy payments which are taken from the parish diocesan accounts in June will now be taken in September. The Diocese hopes that this three-month holiday will be of some help.

### **OTHER NEWS**

- + Ignite Appeal: Looking for a new challenge in September? The Diocesan Youth Service is seeking applications from 18-35 year olds to join the Ignite Team for 2020-2021. Spend a year sharing the Gospel message with children and young people across East Anglia, developing new skills and growing in your faith. - **+ CAFOD** launched its coronavirus emergency appeal on 30 April. Coronavirus (Covid-19) has now spread worldwide, with confirmed cases in many countries where CAFOD works.

The effects of coronavirus on developing countries are likely to be devastating. Many countries have very weak healthcare systems and will not be able to cope. Families without enough to eat and without access to clean water, possibly living with other diseases,

will be particularly vulnerable to coronavirus. It is not just a public health emergency. Many of the world's most vulnerable people will lose their jobs and be unable to support their families. The poorest and most marginalised communities, working hard to transform their lives, will be pushed further into poverty. CAFOD is adapting its programmes to help manage the risk of coronavirus in communities and working with local Church aid agencies on the frontline of this crisis. They are already working to get food to where it is needed most; to improve hygiene, handwashing and sanitation in communities and households; producing radio messages, posters and leaflets in local languages on risks and prevention; and training community volunteers to carry out awareness campaigns. + The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales has responded to the government's document released on 11 May, titled 'Our plan to rebuild: The UK Government's COVID-19 recovery strategy'. Statement:

The timing and the manner of the opening of churches touches profound sensitivities and spiritual needs. The Government's document and statements fail to recognise this.

The Government's position, established today, includes these steps aimed at opening churches as soon as possible: the establishment of a task force for places of worship, to work closely with 'stakeholders' in ensuring that premises are COVID-19 secure; and heeding the experience of other countries in which churches are already open for worship.

In dialogue with the Government, the Catholic Church will continue its engagement in this process and has already submitted a detailed plan, in full accordance with public health guidelines, for churches to be opened for private prayer. The Church is ready to play its full part in the task force, understanding that this includes the possible earlier use of churches for private prayer, as a first safe step towards their use for public worship.
