While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."

  have all found the benefit of livestreaming of
  masses in our parishes to be of real benefit and it
  has enabled parishioners to have the opportunity of
  hearing/watching mass and to stay in touch in these
  difficult times.

The live stream facility that we have could be better in clarity and the internet connection can not always cope with the demand. As it is inevitable we are going to be using this medium into the far seeable future I would like to propose we upgrade our system. A typical example of the camera is the one at St. Laurence's. Unfortunately, this comes at a cost about £5,000 - £7,000 and I am seeking help, by way of donations towards this purchase, if you are able.

Our income, along with that of so many charities and organisations is much depleted this year, which is why I am seeking your support, if you are able, and only if you have the resources to help.
