# LITURGY OF THE WORD

# First Reading: prophet Jonah (3:1-5,10)

The people of Nineveh renounce their evil behaviour

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour,

and God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

\* Sunday of the Word of God: On 30th September

2019, Pope Francis published his Apostolic Letter "Aperuit illis". It officially establishes that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God". Let us make this Sunday special through our love for the Bible, and pray for the courage to apply the Word of God in our daily life.

# \* Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: Pope

Francis explained that this year the theme highlights "Jesus' request that we abide in His love so that we might bear much fruit". He went on to note that the week will conclude on 25 January with the celebration of Vespers in the Basilica of St Paul's Outside-the-Walls in Rome, "together with the representative of the other Churches and Christian communities in Rome". In these days, concluded the Pope "let us pray together so that Jesus' desire might be accomplished – that all might be one: unity, which is always higher that conflict".

\* The new Nuncio for Great Britain, **Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti** has written to the Chapter of Canons about the process for the new Ordinary of our Diocese. Bishop Alan is still our diocesan Bishop until the new one is in place. He asks us to pray for his successor. This Sunday, 24th January, is the anniversary of Bishop Alan's Episcopal Ordination (2003). Let us pray for his happy retirement when his successor officially takes possession of the See of East Anglia.
