THE SYNODAL PATHWAY: WORDS FOR OUR JOURNEY: Hearing Challenges

As a Mental Health Social Worker, I was recently asked to share a small sample of some of my experiences on Radio Maria England for World Day of the Sick Novena, much of which seems fitting for our title 'Hearing Challenges'.

In some shape or form, I have worked in mental health for over 20 years and it's hard not to imagine hearing challenges along the way. Some of those challenges have come directly from individuals such as:

BW whose family life broke down because of his bipolar diagnosis. One minute he was part of a loving family unit, with his wife and 3 healthy boys and next living off the streets and being exploited by teenage girls for his pension and the use of his flat every Friday night.

Then there was CW who had a diagnosis of early onset dementia and whose family supported her long after her she was placed in nursing care, where she roamed the breath and length of the care home, day and night for years. She eventually became immobile and confined to bed.

SW was someone who incessantly rang the emergency services at every available opportunity or quite frankly anyone's number she could get hold of due to high anxiety about being left on her own.

She was a victim of abuse and then ended up in a marriage, where she felt unloved and attempted to commit suicide.

Several scriptures comes to mind as I recall the privilege of being involved in so many people's lives.

My grace is sufficient for you, for my powers is made perfect in weakness. (2 Cor 12:9)

The sufferings of the present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. (Rom 8: 18)

And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, establish and strengthen you. (1 Peter 5:10)

In our small corner, we can still do much to reach out to others who share their challenging stories with us: a kind word, a smile, sharing our time, being friendly, showing respect and understanding, being patient and so on. What wonderful opportunities we have, not only reaching out to others experiencing challenging moments in their lives, but also growing in the many virtues and gifts of the Holy Spirit.
