GAZA On 17 Oct Fr Gabriel Romanelli, parish priest of Holy Family in Gaza called as he is stuck in Bethlehem, having travelled there the day before the conflict started to collect medical supplies for parishioners and now is unable to return to his parish. There are 1017 Christians living in Gaza of which 135 are Roman Catholic. His parish has a compound consisting of the church, presbytery, parish hall, Convent of the Incarnate Word and the Missionary of Charity (Mother Teresa's Sisters) Convent. The Sisters of Mother Teresa look after an orphanage with 54 children and a Residential Home for the Elderly. Outside the compound we have two schools, one LPJ school and the other looked after by the Rosary Sisters.

None of the Christian community have decided to leave the area and travel south to the Rafah Crossing which is where the Israeli Defence Force have told people to go. Currently the Church buildings are sheltering approximately 500 people and the Church is providing food and somewhere to stay. They have decided not to go to Rafah because they believe it will be more dangerous and they want to "stay close to Jesus" in the church!

Bombing is very close and they constantly hear loud explosions outside the parish compound but they are determined to stay together! None of the buildings within the parish compound have been damaged but the Anglican Church Hospital was very badly bombed a few days ago.

Fr Gabriel shared with me the two telephone conversations that he's had with Pope Francis and the encouragement that this has given to the community. He assured me that the Christian community know of the prayers and love people are sending them from across the world and he's grateful for the support from the Knights and Dames of England & Wales.

He finished our conversation by asking people to keep praying and not to forget them. I promised that we will continue to keep them in our hearts!
