A reading from St Paul's First letter to the Thessalonians (1:5-10)

GAZA (Update 21 October 2023):

"As many of you know, there is very sad news that once again mourns the Blessed Land.

Last night at 7.30pm as a result of a bombardment by the Israelis, one of the buildings of the Greek Orthodox Church of Gaza was destroyed. The building collapsed on the hundreds of parishioners who sought refuge there these days. It took place at dusk and without light. People were trying to eat and sleep.

There are many deaths, 18 so far and many more injured, some very seriously and life threatening and many are still trapped under the rubble. This has been a very hard blow to the entire population of Gaza. Many wounded were taken to our Holy Family Latin parish since there is no room for everyone in the hospitals. Many seriously injured people are in a hospital but we don't know for how long.

The Christian community is in deep shock but they continue to pray and discern in each moment what God is asking of them.

Having more than 50 children with disabilities, elderly people who are very sick, the bedridden and now the many injured makes the entire situation more critical. We are now housing more than 700 people in our small Latin church building. They beg us not to stop praying for them to God our Lord and to the Blessed Virgin Mary. We continue to ask from heaven for pity and mercy.

They have asked me dear Abouna to ask you and your friends to pray for them and for everyone and that, whoever can do something, do what is in their power to stop this situation right now.

My people remain strong but for how long I do not know." Fr Gabriel
