St John Fisher came to Cambridge to study in 1480's and in 1504, he became the University's Chancellor for life. In May 1535, he was created Cardinal by Pope Paul III, but he was not allowed to go to Rome to receive the red hat. He was executed on Tower Hill (London) on 22nd June 1535. In 1935, he was canonised together with St Thomas More by Pope Pius XI. On 2nd January 2018, our Parish was erected with Our Lady of Lourdes and St John Fisher as our patrons.

Responsorial Psalm (Psalms 106(107):23-26,28-31)

(R) O give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures for ever.

Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters.

These men have seen the Lord's deeds,

the wonders he does in the deep. (R)

For he spoke; he summoned the gale,

tossing the waves of the sea up to heaven and back into the deep;

Second Reading (A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 5:14-17)

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

Gospel (Mark 4:35-41)

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.'

And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again.

Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

The Nicene Creed
